### End-User Experience

- Online version does not maintain standards of typesetting and formatting found in print
  - "strange margins"
  - "distracting watermarks"
  - "ugliest possible mixture of fonts"
- Inaccurate or missing pagination
- Citations changed from footnotes in print to endnotes in eBook
- Chapter level abstracts and keywords
  - "superfluous material has been added in front of each chapter"

## Why are eBooks different?

- Different formats: XML/EPUB/PDF
  - PDF = "print under glass"
  - EPUB = reflowable text
- Digital conversion process
- OCR or other formatting
- Metadata
- Search algorithms

This chapter argues that tobacco farm families in the Piedmont drew on the evolving culture of bright tobacco agriculture in their challenges to the market forces, especially the monopoly power of the American Tobacco Company after 1890, that drove down tobacco prices in the late nineteenth and early twentieth century. It begins with a description of the tobacco auction markets and how these fit within the culture of bright tobacco. It then moves through a chronological discussion of various protest organizations, local and national, that Piedmont farmers sought to use to challenge the power of tobacco companies in the years between the 1870s and World War I. It argues that tobacco farm families looked to these organizations not out of a generalized angst about the effects of industrial capitalism, but because of their specific complaints about the markets. None of the organizations were able to provide them vehicle for challenging the power of tobacco manufacturers, however.



In the late nineteenth century, the promoters of bright tobacco made big promises about the crop. Prices were high, a Warren County, North Carolina, editor told his readers, because of "short supply" caused by the "enormous use that is being made of tobacco." Demand would never fall below supply, he counseled farmers in the pages of the Gold Leaf. "The prices may fall below what they are at now ... but there will still be more money in growing a crop of tobacco than in making a crop of cotton." 1

Sadly for farm families, he was wrong. Low prices were common in the half-century before the New Deal. The promising high prices of the 1870s faltered in the late 1880s, when increased production in eastern North Carolina and South Carolina put more leaf on the market and drove prices down. Prices fell precipitously in the 1890s, when the American Tobacco Company (ATC) gained near-monopoly power over much of the tobacco industry and farmers found fewer buyers for their crops. 


