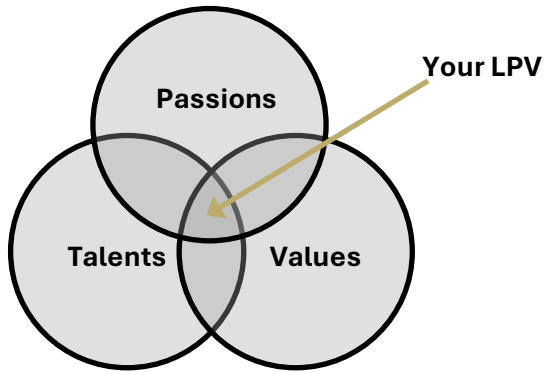


Leadership Point of View (LPV) Worksheet
