Dr. Skinner is the Executive Director of <u>Educopia Institute</u>, whose mission is to "build networks and collaborative communities to help cultural, scientific, and scholarly institutions to achieve greater impact". Dr. Skinner received her Ph.D. from Emory University. She has co-edited three books and has authored and co-authored numerous reports and articles. She is currently Principal Investigator for research projects on continuing education (Nexus, Mapping the Landscapes), digital preservation (ETD plus, Chronicles in Preservation), and scholarly communication (Chrysalis). She regularly teaches graduate courses and workshops in digital librarianship and preservation topics, and provides consultation services to groups that are planning or implementing digital scholarship and digital preservation programs.

	This interactive session will introduce two innovative, highly collaborative programs in Colorado. Check Out Colorado State Parks is a unique partnership between the Colorado State Library, Colorado Parks and Wildlife, and 387 libraries (public, military and academic) across the state that provides free access to state parks to library patrons through circulating state park passes and nature backpacks. One Book 4 Colorado, a collaboration between the State Library, Lt. Governor's Office, Denver Preschool Program, and all Colorado public and military libraries, provides a copy of the same free book to every 4 year old in the state (75,000 copies) through public libraries for 2 weeks each spring.
